Deputy Surveyors, in 1879.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 0° 25' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.</p> <p>Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush, heavy juniper and pinon pine.</p> <p>39.29 The original ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with the decayed remains of a shaved wooden post, in pieces, in the center of a circle of stone, from which the only remaining original bearing tree</p> <p>A juniper, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 29° E., 48 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on open blaze.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T24N R49E R50E ¼ S 36 S 31</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1979</p> <p>Reset the wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p> <hr/>
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
