

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BOUNDARY
 (THE RUBY VALLEY GUIDE MERIDIAN)
 TOWNSHIP 26 NORTH, RANGE 55 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

40.24

Over rolling land, covered with crested wheat grass.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a wooden post, 1 in. square, 10 ins. long, with illegible scribing visible, wired to a steel fence post, firmly set 16 ins. in the ground.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 15 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the original wooden post and the steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the iron post.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 26 North, Range 55 East is about 5,700 to 5,800 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy clay, gravely and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush and crested wheat grass.

Access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved desert trail roads.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen.

The area is drained by Huntington Creek, which winds southerly through the eastern portion of the township.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
