GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 25 North, Range 56 East is about 5,800 to 6,600 ft. above sea level and is rolling to mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush and crested wheat grass. There are scattered juniper and pinon pine throughout the township.

Access into the township is provided by an improved bladed road crossing from north to south, entering in section 5 and leaving in section 33 and numerous other desert trail roads.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen.
