Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 22 North, Range 40 East, ranges from about 5,300 to 6,700 ft. above sea level. The eastern half of the township consists of gently rolling to rolling land. The soil is sandy clay loam, with gravel, covered with shadscale, whitesage, sagebrush and bunchgrass. The New Pass range of mountains is located in the western half of the Township with the soil consisting of a clay loam covered with rocks, juniper, pinon pine, sagebrush and bunchgrass.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved dirt roads. No mining activity of consequence was noted during the survey.
