Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
G. W. Conkling and T. K. Stewart,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyors,  
in 1882.

From the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 N., Rs. 41 and 42 E.,  
monumented with a basalt stone, 26x18x10 ins., firmly  
set 16 ins. in the ground, plainly mkd. 6 notches on the  
N., S., E. and W. edges and firmly set in a mound of  
stone.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 10  
ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of  
stone, 4 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.
