GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 41 North, Range 19 East is about 5,600 to 7,100 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to mountainous land. The soil is sandy alkaline in the lower elevations and rocky on the high elevations. The land is covered with sagebrush, native grasses, greasewood and rabbitbrush with quaking aspens, bitterbrush and juniper in the higher elevations.

There is a graded gravel road, State Route No. 34, crossing in a northeast direction entering in sec. 13 and exiting in sec. 3. There are numerous trail roads scattered throughout the township.

An intermittent lake, known as Central Lake, lies in secs. 2 and 3. Orphan Reservoir is located in sec. 34.

Button Brush Windmill was noted in sec. 23.

Principal users of the area are ranchers and farmers.

Range separation fences are scattered throughout the area.
