CHAINS	<p>S. 89° 34' W., bet. secs. 7 and 18.</p> <p>Over gently rolling land, through scattered juniper, pinon pine, sagebrush and bunchgrass.</p> <p>35.50 Trail road, bears NW. and SE.</p> <p>41.26 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 18, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><div>T22N R43E</div><div><div>S 7</div><div>$\frac{1}{4}$ S 18</div></div></div> <p>1979</p> <p>80.71 The cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, on the W. bdy. of the Tp.</p>
	<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 22 North, Range 43 East is about 5,300 to 6,800 ft. above sea level and is rolling to mountainous. The soil is sandy clay loam along the bottom land and rocky on the high elevations. The land is covered with sagebrush, bunchgrass, native grass, scattered juniper and pinon pine. The river bottom is covered with meadow grass.</p> <p>State Highway No. 8-A crosses the township from south to north entering in section 32 and leaving in section 2.</p> <p>The Reese River enters the area in section 31 and leaves in section 2.</p> <p>Principal user of the area is for livestock grazing.</p> <p>No mineral formations of any consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
