The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, determined at cor. of fences, from which fences bear N. and E. This point is locally recognized as the corner and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

From the cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33.

N. 89° 46' W., bet. secs. 29 and 32.

Over gently rolling land, through scattered aspen, sagebrush and native grass; along fence.

3.50 Soldier Creek, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course NNE.

40.42 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 32, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the remonumentation of certain corners in T. 34 N., R. 59 E., executed under Group No. 393.

This cor. is located 4 lks. S. of a fence, bearing E. and W.

S. 89° 56' W., beginning new measurement.

Over gently rolling land, along fence.

40.47 The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 34 North, Range 59 East is about 5,880 to 9,200 ft. above sea level and is rolling land in the lower elevations and mountainous in the higher elevations. At the higher elevations the land is very broken with numerous series of sheer ledges and broken rock outcrops. The soil at the lower elevations is a rich, sandy loam. The higher elevations are very rocky. The vegetation is sagebrush, buckbrush and bitterbrush with mahogany, juniper, pinon pine and scattered quaking aspen at the higher elevations.

There are scattered trail roads in the lower elevations. There is a graded dirt road in Soldier Creek Canyon.
