CHAINS

Deposit the original cornerstone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

N. 0° 13' E., along the E. bdy. of sec. 1.

Over gently rolling land, covered with sagebrush and native grass.

15.80 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 1½ ft. deep, drains WNW.

40.48 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Hereafter, this cor. will refer to sec. 1 only.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

41.90 Wash, 25 lks. wide, 1½ ft. deep, drains WNW.

80.96 The cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set showing 8 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 27 N., R. 44 E., executed under Group No. 36.
