## CHAINS

Bury the unmarked stone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post and rebuild the mound of stone, 2½ ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

N. 0° 46' W., beginning new measurement.

Over rolling land.

The closing cor. of T. 40 N., Rs. 51 and 52 E., monumented with a wooden post, 2 ins. square, 24 ins. long, no scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
