Reset the original cornerstone and set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 2 ft. in the ground, alongside the aluminum post and rebuild the mound of stone, 3 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 39 North, Range 68 East varies from mountainous in the west portion to nearly level in the central portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,300 to 6,700 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to sandy clay loam on the level areas. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, bitterbrush, buckbrush, cacti, Brigham tea and native grass. There is timber in the mountains consisting of pinon pine, juniper and mountain mahogany.

Access into the resurveyed portion of township is limited to only a few rough trail roads.

The principal use of the area is livestock grazing. No mineral formations of any consequence were noted during the survey.
