Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
H. Fitzhugh, U. S. Deputy Surveyor,  
in 1894.

From the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 38 N., R. 66 E., executed under Group No. 543.

N.  $0^{\circ} 30'$  W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, covered with medium sagebrush, scattered cacti and native grass.

40.32 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a wooden post, 2x4 ins, 30 ins. long, loosely set in a mound of earth, plainly scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on two faces.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
