DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 39 N., R. 66 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS 44.11

The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 40 N., R. 66 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 39 North, Range 66 East and a portion of Township 40 North, Range 65 East is gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 5,700 to 6,100 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and rocky to sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of bitterbrush, Indian paintbrush, bleeding heart, cacti, shadscale, sagebrush, rabbitbrush, crested wheat grass and native grass. There is scattered juniper in the southwest corner, along the east boundary and the east half of the north boundary of T. 39 N., R. 66 E. The east boundary of T. 39 N., R. 66 E. also has a few pinon pine.

The township is drained by numerous small washes flowing into Toano Draw, which drains the entire area entering in 35, proceeds in a generally NNE. direction and exits in sec. 6. There are water wells located in secs. 16 and 30. There is a rundown shack located in the southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 13. Access is provided by a trail road along the east side of Toano Draw and several minor trail roads branching off from this trail road. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
