CHAINS	<p>Point for the W ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 1, determined WEST of the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, T. 39 N., Rs. 52½ and 53 E., and on the E. bdy. of sec. 1, T. 39 N., R. 52 E.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T39N R52E R52½E   ¼   S 1</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1981</p> <p>Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the iron post.</p> <p>From this corner, the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, T. 39 N., R. 52 E., bears S. 0° 41' W., 9.71 chs. dist.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land surveyed in Township 39 North, Range 52½ East ranges from 6,200 to 7,500 ft. above sea level and is mountainous. The soil varies from sandy loam to rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush and native grasses.</p> <p>The Taylor Canyon Creek crosses through the south portion of sec. 24, course NW.</p> <p>Some mining operations are situated throughout the township. Principle users of the township are cattlemen.</p> <p>Nevada State Highway No. 226 crosses through the township along the north side of Taylor Canyon Creek. Further access to the township is provided by numerous trail roads.</p> <hr/>
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
