

TOWNSHIP 26 NORTH, RANGE 19 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land resurveyed in Township 26 North, Range 19 East, ranges from about 4,000 to 6,300 ft. above sea level and varies from nearly level dry lake in the western central portion to mountainous in the southeastern portion. The soil varies from sandy and sandy clay loam to rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, Indian paintbrush, Brigham tea, buckbrush, rabbitbrush, serviceberry brush, willows, cottonwood trees, pinon pine, juniper, callow lilies, quaken aspen and native grasses.

The principal users of the area are cattle grazers and hay growers.

Access is provided by an improved gravel road that enters the township about midway on the west boundary of sec. 30 and winds around in a northerly and easterly direction before exiting the township in a northerly direction in sec. 2. There are several trail roads off this main road.

Fish Springs and a ranch are located in sec. 19. Cottonwood Creek and branches enter the township in the southeast corner of sec. 34 and drain in a general northerly direction.

No mineral formations of any consequence were noted during the survey.
