and James W. Hardison, Assistant Cadastral Engineer,
in 1944.

From the original cor. of Tps. 28 N., Rs. 56 and 57 E.,
monumented with a granite stone, 18x12x8 ins., plainly
mkd. with 6 notches on the N., E. and W. edges, firmly
set in a mound of stone, with an unmarked iron post, 36
ins. long, 3 ins. diam., lying alongside. Hereafter,
this corner will become an amended monument in sec.
31, T. 28 N., R. 57 E.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 3 ins. diam., 6 ins. in
the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4
ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

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Bury the cornerstone alongside the iron post.

S. 89° 50' W., along the original S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, through heavy sagebrush, wild
rose bushes, juniper, pinon, mahogany and aspen.

- 5.23 The NE. closing cor. of sec. 1, T. 27 N., R. 56 E.,
monumented with an aluminum post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly
set, showing 18 ins. above the ground and in a mound of
stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with aluminum cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of T. 27 N., R. 56 E., executed concurrently under this
same Group.
- 6.50 Forest Service trail, bears WNW. and ESE.
- 9.50 Brown Creek, 10 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, course WNW.
- 10.70 The closing cor. of Tp. 28 N., Rs. 56 and 57 E.,
hereinafter described.
- 39.98 The ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, monumented with an iron
post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, showing 10 ins. above the
ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field
notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the S.
bdy. of T. 28 N., R. 56 E., executed under Group No.
191. Remark the brass cap to read as follows:
