CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 28 North, Range 56 East, ranges from about 5,600 to 7,600 ft. above sea level. The east portion of the township is located on the western slope of the Ruby Mountains, the remainder lies in the Huntington Valley. The soil varies from sandy clay loam in the valley to gravelly with rocky outcroppings in the mountains.

The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush, greasewood and crested wheatgrass in the valley.

There are scattered to heavy juniper, pinion, mahogany, aspen, and wild rose bushes in the mountains.

The township is drained by Brown Creek, Pearl Creek, and Frost Creek which flows westerly through the township.

There are ranches located in sections 1, 9, 12, 21 and 28.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by numerous improved and unimproved roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
