Over high rolling mountainous land, covered with sagebrush and native grass.

Point for the cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
