The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with an unmarked basalt stone, $12x7x4$ ins., firmly set in a mound of stone. This point correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the original corner.
