Reset the decayed remains of the original wooden post alongside the aluminum post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high N. of cor.

N. 88° 49' W., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land.

- 1.48 The N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, T. 21 N., R. 47 E., monumented with an aluminum post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, showing 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the subdivisional lines, T. 21 N., R. 47 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.
- 5.20 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.
- 5.30 Fence, parallels trail road.
- 19.20 Improved gravel road, bears NE. and SW.
- 39.99 The cor. of Tps. 21 and 22 N., Rs. 46 and 47 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, showing 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the independent resurvey of a portion of the N. boundary, T. 21 N., R. 47 E., executed under Group No. 91.
- From this corner, a U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "TEA", monumented with a standard brass tablet set in concrete, with brass tablet mkd. TEA 1954, bears S. 55° 04' E., 5.07 chs. dist.

- 12.50 Callaghan Creek, channel, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains NE.
- 17.50 Callaghan Creek, channel, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains ENE.
