Point for the 80 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 1, determined at 80 chs. in latitude from the closing cor. of Tps. 21½ and 22 N., Rs. 51½ E. and on the E. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 22N., R. 51 E.,
