## LORRAINE NO. 2 LODE

From cor. No. 2 of M.S. No. 4704, Lorraine No. 2 Lode, monumented with a rhyolite stone, 24X10X10 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. L 2 2 4704 on the E. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the original cornerstone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the iron post.

Thence S. 15° 22' E.

The West Side Center cor. of M.S. No. 4704, Lorraine No. 2 Lode, monumented with a rhyolite stone, 24X12X6 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. WSC L2 4704 on the E. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 22 North, Range 51 East is between 6,400 and 8,400 ft. elevation above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay loam in the lower elevations and rocky in the mountains. The undergrowth consists of scattered sagebrush, crested wheat grass, juniper, pinon pine and mountain mahogany.

Numerous trail roads are located in secs. 1 and 12, as well as a large amount of mining activity.

Principal users of the area are miners and local ranchers.
