The soil is sandy clay loam along the bottom land and rocky on the high elevations. The land is covered with sagebrush, native grass and cheatgrass, with juniper and pinon pine in the higher elevations.</p> <p>There is a graded gravel road entering in sec. 36 and leaving in sec. 19. There is also a graded gravel road entering in sec. 36 and leaving in sec. 24.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are ranchers.</p> <p>There were no mineral formation of consequence noted during the survey.</p> <hr/>
