M.S. NO. 4030, N.B. AND GOLDEN WAVE LODES


## CHAINS

9.102

Cor. No. 2, M.S. No. 4030, Golden Wave lode, monumented with a pine post, 4 ins. square, 3½ ft. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.




Deposit the original wooden post alongside the aluminum post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, NE. of cor.

Thence S. 87° 57' E.

Cor. No. 3, M.S. No. 4030, Golden Wave lode, determined by intersection of parallel side and end lines from existing original corners.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.



Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, NW. of cor.

Thence N. 11° 46' W.

Cor. No. 4, Golden Wave lode, identical with Cor. No. 4, N.B. lode, both of M.S. No. 4030, hereinbefore described.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area surveyed and resurveyed within Township 17 North, Range 64 East is mountainous and ranges in elevation from 6,600 to 9,400 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam in the foothills to rocky at the higher elevations. The summit of Duck Creek Range is located on the east side of section 34, projects in a northerly direction, and exits on the east side of section 3. The Duck Creek Range divides the drainages into easterly or westerly flows. There is limited access provided by trail roads. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grasses with timber of pinon pine, juniper and mountain mahogany.

There are three seep springs located in sec. 35. Excavations indicating search for minerals are located throughout the area.
