

RETRACEMENT OF A PORTION OF THE NEVADA-IDAHO STATE LINE
BETWEEN MILE POST NOS. 38 AND 44

CHAINS

59.77 The Idaho closing cor. of secs. 25 and 26, T. 16 S., R. 13 E., monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 5 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the survey in T. 16 S., R. 13 E., executed under Group No. 29, Idaho, bears NORTH 0.02 chs. dist.

60.12 The closing cor. of Tps. 47 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E., hereinafter described.

62.10 Creek, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course S.

79.49 The 44th Mile Post, monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, 36 ins. long, 4 ins. diam., loosely set in a mound of stone, in a fence bearing WNW. and ESE.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
