

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SECOND STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH,
THROUGH RANGE 63 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS
39.14

The standard cor. of Tps. 11 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E., monumented with a limestone, 22X14X10 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, plainly mkd. with 6 grooves on the S. face, 6 notches on the E. and W. edges and SC on the N. face.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 2 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 6 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

Bury the original cornerstone alongside the aluminum post.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land along the Second Standard Parallel North, through Range 63 East, is about 6,900 to 8,500 ft. above sea level and is rolling to mountainous land. The soil is sandy clay loam along the rolling land and rocky at the high elevations. The land is covered with medium to heavy timber, sagebrush and native grass.

There is an improved gravel road providing access just east of the township running generally north and south.

Principal users of the area are ranchers.
