The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, this position was determined by a hole in the ground where the iron post had been removed, with a mound of stone to the W. This position correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
