GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 38 North, Range 62 East, varies from mountainous to gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 5,600 to 7,470 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of rabbit brush, greasewood, sagebrush, meadow grass and other sparse native grass, with small stands of willows along the Humboldt River.

The Humboldt River crosses the township from SE. to NW., entering in section 32 and leaving in section 30. Town Creek drains the SE. portion of the township. There are hot springs in section 17 and small seep springs located in sections 11, 20 and 21.

A mining operation is situated in section 16. No other mining deposits of value were noted.

There are radio facilities with towers located in sections 11, 28, 29 and 33.

The Western Pacific and Southern Pacific Railroads cross the south-western portion of the township from SE. to WNW. U.S. Highway No. 93, crosses the south-eastern portion. Other access into the area is provided by a paved road on the west half of the township with numerous secondary and desert trail roads throughout the township.

The Wells Sewage Disposal Ponds are located in section 32.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen.
