Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by
H. B. Maxson, U.S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1894.

From the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E.
and T. 38½ N., R. 62 E., monumented with an iron post,
2½ ins. diam., firmly set showing 6 ins. above the
ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field
notes of the dependent resurvey of the north boundary
of T. 38 N., R. 62 E., executed concurrently under this
same Group.

N. 89° 46' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush.

12.90 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.

39.55 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at
proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence
of the original corner. This corner now refers to sec.
36 only.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the iron
post.

39.60 Spur, slopes S.

44.44 Point for the N. ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 38½ N., R.
62 E., hereinafter described.

73.20 Fence, bears NNW. and SSE.

79.10 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with a
granite stone, 16X12X10 ins., plainly mkd. with 5
notches on the W. edge and 1 notch on E. edge, firmly
set in a mound of stone. This corner now refers to
secs. 35 and 36 only.
