Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by
U.S. Deputy Surveyors J. C. Smyles and C. S. Preble,
in 1881.

From the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 68 and 69 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set
showing 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of the Seventh Standard Parallel North, through Range
69 East, executed concurrently under this same Group.

N. 89° 38' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over nearly level land, through scattered sagebrush.

1.52 The N. ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 6, hereinafter described.

38.54 The closing cor. of Tps. 35 N., Rs. 68 and 69 E.,
hereinafter described.

40.01 The standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 36 N., R. 68
E., monumented with a wooden post, 2 ins. square, 16
ins. long, loosely set in a mound of earth, with
illegible scribe marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
