

## TOWNSHIP 36 NORTH, RANGE 69 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within T. 36 N., R. 69 E., varies from mountainous in the eastern portion where the Pilot Range is located to nearly level in the central portion along Pilot Creek with the remaining terrain being rolling. The elevation ranges from about 4,500 ft. to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam along the more level portions to rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and native grass with juniper and pinon pine in the mountainous portions. Pilot Creek drains the township, which enters the township in the west half of section 4, proceeds in a southerly direction, and leaves the township in the west half of section 33. Drainages located on the east side of Pilot Creek generally drain westerly into it and vice versa for drainages west of Pilot Creek. Access is provided by an improved gravel road which enters the township in the west half of section 3, projects in a SSW. direction and exits in the west half of section 32. There are numerous secondary roads which feed out from the improved gravel road. There is a gravel pit on the section line between sections 9 and 16. Springs are found in section 1, and a well has been drilled in section 2.

Principal users of the area are ranchers and for recreational purposes.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
