T. 32 N., R. 33 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
E. H. Dyer, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1863,
the Resurvey Executed by F. H. Criss, U.S. Deputy
Surveyor, in 1901 and J. R. Munson, Cadastral Surveyor,
in 1974 and the Investigation Survey Executed by
C. S. Swanholm, U.S. Surveyor, in 1919 and 1920.

From the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 35, monumented
with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and
showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of the south boundary, T. 32 N., R. 33 E., executed
under Group No. 498. This corner will now also refer
to the NW. cor. of sec. 35, T. $31\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 33 E.

Over mountainous land, covered with scattered juniper,
shadscale and native grass.

- 24.50 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.
- 27.70 Ravine, drains NW.
- 31.30 Ridge, bears N. and S.
- 37.50 Ravine, drains N. 20° E.
- 39.24 The closing cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. $31\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 33
E., hereinafter described.
- 39.70 Spur, slopes N.
- 40.41 The standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with
an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of
stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field
notes of the dependent resurvey of the south boundary,
T. 32 N., R. 33 E., executed under Group No. 498. Add
the marks 1984 to the brass cap.
