## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY, T. 31 N., R. 33 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

From the cor, of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, established by the 1893 survey and identified in the 1919 and 1920 investigation survey, monumented with a limestone, 25X10X5 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, plainly mkd. with 5 grooves on the S. face and dimly mkd. with 1 notch on the N. edge. This corner now becomes the cor. of sec. 1 and 6, Tps. 31 N., Rs. 33 and  $33\frac{1}{2}$  E.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

From this corner, the closing cor. of secs. 6 and 12, Tps. 31 N., Rs. 33 and  $33\frac{1}{2}$  E., monumented with an aluminum post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the survey of the south boundary, T. 31 N., R.  $33\frac{1}{2}$  E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears EAST, 2.22 chs. dist.

The fractional section line bet. secs. 7 and 12, Tps. 31 N., Rs. 33 and 34 E., established by the 1893 survey, was fully retraced and careful search was made for evidence of the intervening corners, none of which were recovered.

N. 1° 30' E., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, covered with medium juniper, sagebrush, scattered rabbitbrush, Brigham tea and bunchgrass.

4.122 Intersect line 3-4 of M.S. No. 4195, Humboldt lode, at a point from which:

Cor. No. 4, Humboldt lode, identical with Cor. No. 3, Humboldt No. 2 lode, both of M.S. No. 4195, monumented with the decayed remains of a pine post with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of stone, from which the original bearing tree

A juniper, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 28° W., 187 lks. dist., with nearly healed blaze with illegible scribe marks visible. (Record distance 185.9 lks.)

At the corner point
