

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,  
T. 31 N., R. 33 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 19 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

From this corner, the original closing cor. of Tps. 31 N., Rs. 33 and 34 E., established by the 1893 survey and identified in the 1919 and 1920 investigation survey, monumented with a limestone, 14X13X7 ins., loosely set in a mound of stone, plainly mkd. with 6 grooves on the E. and W. faces, bears N.  $0^{\circ} 35'$  E., 0.13 chs. dist. This corner now becomes an amended monument. Add the marks AM and bury the original cornerstone.

From this same corner, the S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 36, T. 31 $\frac{1}{2}$  N., R. 33 E., monumented with an aluminum post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set and showing 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the south boundary of T. 31 $\frac{1}{2}$  N., R. 33 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears N.  $88^{\circ} 21'$  W., 7.86 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the SW. cor. of sec. 31, T. 32 N., R. 34 E., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the south boundary T. 32 N., R. 34 E., executed under Group No. 491, bears S.  $88^{\circ} 21'$  E., 31.55 chs. dist.
