<p>39.80</p>	<p>Telephone line, bears N. 59° W. and S. 59° E.</p>
<p>41.00</p>	<p>The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the east boundary of T. 34 N., R. 54 E., executed under Group No. 462. <p>Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyor H. B. Maxson, in 1896.</p>	
<p>From the cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 54 and 55 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the west boundary of T. 34 N., R. 55 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.</p> <p>N. 89° 57' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.</p> <p>Over rolling land, covered with scattered sagebrush and cheatgrass.</p>	
<p>8.40</p>	<p>Ridge, bears NW. and SE.</p>
<p>11.70</p>	<p>Trail road, bears N. and S.</p>
<p>27.30</p>	<p>Ravine, drains SE.</p>
<p>40.47</p>	<p>Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p>
