From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, in the center of a mound of stone, alongside a rebar, 5/8 in. diam., exposed 8 ins. above the ground. This point correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the wooden post the rebar and set a steel fence post,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. long, alongside the iron post.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
