DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE WEST BOUNDARY,  
T. 33 N., R. 55 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of a portion of the Survey Executed by  
C. C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor,  
in 1868,  
and a Portion of the Survey Executed by  
H. B. Maxson, U.S. Deputy Surveyor,  
in 1896.

From the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, monumented  
with the decayed remains of a wooden post, in the  
center of a mound of stone, alongside a rebar, 5/8 in.  
diam., exposed 8 ins. above the ground. This point  
correlates well with other existing original corners  
and is accepted as the best available evidence of the  
position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 6 ins.  
in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4  
ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the wooden post the rebar and set a steel fence  
post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 17' W., bet. secs. 7 and 12.

Over rolling land, covered with scattered sagebrush,  
greasewood, cheatgrass and juniper.

- 6.70 Ridge, bears NNE. and SSW.
- 34.40 Trail road, bears E. and W.
- 39.41 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, monumented with a  
wooden post, 3 ins. square, 30 ins. long, firmly set in  
the ground alongside a steel fence post, with illegible  
scribe marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
