Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by  
C. C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1868,  
and a Portion of the Survey Executed by A. J. Hatch,  
W. W. Skinner and C. S. Preble, U.S. Deputy Surveyors,  
in 1874.

From the standard cor. of secs. 32 and 33, determined  
at the 1874 record bearing and dist., from the closing  
cor. of secs. 4 and 5, T. 30 N., R. 56 E. Extensive  
retracemnts and discussion with local surveyors and  
landowners indicate that the closing cor. of secs. 4  
and 5 is the only cor. within a reasonable distance  
which is locally recognized as an original monument.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this corner, the closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, T.  
30 N., R. 56 E., monumented with a willow post, 1 in.  
diam., loosely set and showing 18 ins. above the  
ground, with illegible scribe marks visible, alongside  
a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, bears WEST, 2.38 chs.  
dist.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the original willow post and the steel fence post
