Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
C. C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1868, and
the Resurvey Executed by W. T. Moran,
U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1890.

From the standard cor. of secs. 32 and 33, monumented with a wooden post, 6 ins. diam., firmly set in a collar of stone, exposed 5 ft. above the ground. This position is harmoniously related to other found original cors., has long been recognized as the cor. by adjacent landowners, and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, to solid rock and in a mound of stone, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the wooden post alongside the iron post.

N. $89^{\circ} 37'$ W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 32.

Over rolling land, through heavy sagebrush, desc. over W. slope.

- 5.61 The closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, monumented with an unmarked granite stone, 20X7X3 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, bears NORTH, 0.015 chs. (Record: wooden post.)
- 15.90 Creek, 2 lks. wide, 6 ins. deep, course N. 20° W.; desc. over SW. slope through scattered sagebrush.
- 18.80 Improved road, bears N. 20° E. and S. 20° W.
- 40.01 Point for the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
