GENERAL DESCRIPTION Township 31 North, Range 57 East is situated about 20 miles SSE. of Elko, Nevada. The elevation of the area surveyed varies from about 5,800 to 6,800 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy loam in the lower elevations to solid basalt and granite rock in the higher elevations. Sections 3, 10 and the east one-half of section 32 are located in the foothills of the Ruby Mountains. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey. Timber in the area is mainly juniper, cottonwood and aspen. No timber of commercial value was noted. The principle users of the township are cattlemen and sheepmen. Access to the area is by numerous secondary dirt roads and desert jeep trails. These trails and roads connect to Nevada State Highway No. 46 to the west and a medium duty, hard surfaced road to the north.
