Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U.S. Deputy Surveyors A. J. Hatch and J. H. Eaton
in 1870
and the Resurvey Executed by
U.S. Deputy Surveyor H. B. Maxson,
in 1894.

From the cor. of Tps. 38, 38½ and 39 N., Rs. 62 and 63
E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly
set showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of T. 38 N., R. 62 E., executed under Group No. 605.

N. 0° 10' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, covered with sagebrush, rabbitbrush
and cheatgrass.

22.50 Trail road, bears W. and E.

23.50 Creek, 5 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course SE.

39.20 Creek, 5 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course SE.

39.91 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with a
granite stone, 12X6X6 ins., firmly set in a mound of
stone, plainly mkd. ¼ on W. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the original cornerstone and set a steel fence
post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 11' E., beginning new measurement.

Over rolling land.

39.80 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with a
granite stone, 30X10X10 ins., firmly set 15 ins. in the
ground, plainly mkd. with 5 notches on N. edge and 1
notch on S. edge.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins.
in the ground, to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3
ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.
