Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by  
D. H. Barker, C. S. Preble and E. C. McClellan,  
U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1879.  
and a Portion of the Resurvey Executed by  
U.S. Deputy Surveyor H. B. Maxson, in 1894.

From the cor. of Tps. 38 and 39 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E.,  
monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set  
showing 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as  
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey  
of T. 38 N., R. 62 E., executed under Group No. 605.

N. 3° 28' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, covered with sagebrush and native  
grass, along fence.

4.30 Bishop Creek, 20 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, course SW.

23.30 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.

41.05 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, determined at the  
corner of fences, from which fences bear, N., S. and  
SW. This fence corner correlates well with other  
existing original corners and is accepted as the best  
available evidence of the position of the original  
corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
