DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF
THE NORTH BOUNDARY,
T. 8 N., R. 56 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
A. G. Bateman and E. B. Monroe,
U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1873.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with a concrete monument, 3 ins. square, firmly set showing 4 ins. above ground, with a steel fence post firmly set alongside, and with the decayed remains of a wooden post loosely set alongside. This is accepted as a careful and faithful perpetuation of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

Deposit the concrete monument and decayed remains of the wooden post and reset the steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the aluminum post.

N. 89° 22' W., bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Over gently rolling land, consisting of moist alkali and covered with scattered greasewood and shadscale.

Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
