Raise a mound of stone, 2½ ft. base, 1½ ft. high, E. of cor.

From this corner, the E ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 18 N., R. 62 E., hereinbefore described, bears N. 0° 09' W., 3.96 chs. dist.

Point for the W 80 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 31 is at 80.00 chs. in latitude from the closing cor. of secs. 30 and 31 and on the E. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 18 N., R. 62 E.

Set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the aluminum post.

From this corner, the E 80 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 18 N., R. 62 E., hereinbefore described, bears N. 0° 09' W., 3.97 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the confines of this survey in Township 18 North, Range 63 East, located approximately 8 miles north of Ely, Nevada, and more specifically, in Smith Valley, 2 miles northwest of Hercules Gap, is rolling land. The elevation is about 6,600 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam and the vegetation consists of medium to scattered densities of juniper and pinon pine in the northeast part and scattered sagebrush, native grass and sparse cacti. Drainage is primarily southwesterly along the alluvial fan of the Egan Range.

Access is gained via Bothwick Road which, commencing in Ely, enters the area at the south boundary of section 31, heading in a straight northwesterly direction through the section. There are numerous trail roads in the area. In addition, there is a power line which basically parallels Bothwick Road.

Principal users of the area are landowners, hunters and wood cutters.
