W. Garside, U.S. Deputy Surveyor in 1878, and a Portion of the Resurvey Executed by W. E. Hoffman, U.S. Surveyor in 1915. From the cor. of secs. 33 and 34, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 15 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy. of T. 40 N., R. 20 E., executed under Group No. 12. N. 1° 51' E., bet. secs. 33 and 34. Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush. 39.65 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 33 and 34, monumented with an unmarked lava stone, 15X13X10 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone. This point correlates well with other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner. This corner now refers to sec. 33 only. At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd. **T40N R20E** \$ 33| 1985 Deposit the unmarked cornerstone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor. N. 1° 59' E., beginning new measurement. Over mountainous land. 0.38 The W 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 34, hereinafter described. 6.90 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains NW.
