		GENERAL DESCRIPTION The area resurveyed within Township 28 North, Range 52 East, ranges from about 5,200 to 5,400 ft. above sea level, and is mostly level land to gently rolling land. The soil varies from sandy in the bottom land to sandy clay loam in the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and sparse native grass. The township is drained by Pine Creek which flows generally north, which enters the township in sec. 31 and exits in sec. 6. An abandoned railroad enters the township in sec. 31 and exits in sec. 6. Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the area is provided by an unimproved road.
