monumented with a limestone, 18X12X6 ins., firmly set
10 ins. in the ground and plainly mkd. with 1 groove on
E. face and 5 grooves on W. face, from which the
original bearing trees

A juniper, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 51° E., 39 lks.
dist., mkd. T29N R51E S36 BT. (Record N. 37° 30'
E., 53 lks. dist.)

A juniper, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 21° W., 111
lks. dist., mkd. T29N R51E S35 BT. (Record N. 22°
W., 129 lks. dist.)

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24
ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by
W. M. Kearney, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1909.

The amended monument for the cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N.,
Rs. 51 and 52 E., as surveyed by Kearney, monumented
with an aluminum post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set
showing 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of T. 27 N., R. 51 E.,
concurrently resurveyed under this same Group.

N. 0° 04' W., across sec. 31, T. 28 N., R. 52 E.

Over gently rolling land, covered with sagebrush and
native grass.
