Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by
C. F. Putnam and W. F. Benson, U.S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1880,
and the Resurvey Executed by J. D. Archer,
U.S. Transitman, in 1911.

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, Tps. 39 N., Rs. 18
and 19 E., monumented with a trapstone, 18X12X9 ins.,
firmly set in a mound of stone, plainly mkd. with 5
grooves on S. face and 1 groove on N. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 15 ins.
in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4
ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the original cornerstone alongside the iron
post.

NORTH, bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush,
native grass, juniper and mahogany.

5.80 Ridge, bears NW. and SE.

13.20 Ravine, drains E.

37.90 Abandoned fence corner, bears WEST, 1.84 chs. dist.,
from which fence bears N. and W.

40.38 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at
proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence
of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
