GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 39 North, Range 19 East, ranges from about 6,300 to 7,400 ft. above sea level and is mountainous land. This soil is rocky over most of the area however, along the stream bottom the soil is sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush, bunchgrass, quaking aspen and mahogany.

The township is drained by Mountain View Creek, which flows in a south-easterly direction.

Principal users of the area are ranchers and access into the area is provided by unimproved roads.
