GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 40 North, Range 18 East, ranges from about 5,900 to 7,000 ft. above sea level, and is mountainous to rolling. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass. There are scattered juniper and mahogany on the higher elevations of little commercial value.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by desert trail roads throughout the township.
